Training on Mycotoxin Determination Methods

The International Food Safety Training Laboratory is offering a 9-day hands-on laboratory training on the methods of determination of Mycotoxins in food. Mycotoxins are naturally occurring toxins produced by certain fungi growing on grains, nuts and other agricultural product. The extent of fungi growth is influenced by environmental factors during production, harvest and storage, but also varies by geographical location.
