The Office of Food for Peace is pleased to announce the launch of the Food for Peace Management Information System (FFPMIS), which will support proposal submissions, reporting, and program and financial management for all current and future Food for Peace programs. Title II development and emergency food assistance programs, Emergency Food Security Programs, and International Food Relief Partnership Programs will all be awarded and administered through FFPMIS.

Use of FFPMIS will be required for all submissions made on/after January 2, 2013.

Attached [here](#) is a user registration form, which is required for access to FFPMIS. Please return a signed copy of this form as soon as possible to ffpmis_support@devis.com. Your username and a temporary password will then be issued via email. If you signed a user registration form at a FFPMIS training earlier this fall, please note this in an email to ffpmis_support@devis.com requesting access to the system. We ask that each organization limit its request to five users; additional users may be approved in exceptional circumstances only.

Featured Information Resource: Emergency Food Security & Livelihoods 48-hour Assessment Tool

The purpose of the 48-hour assessment tool is to obtain a quick understanding of the emergency food security and livelihood (EFSL) situation within the first few days after a rapid-onset disaster. Initially developed by Oxfam and further developed by the [Emergency Capacity Building Project](#), this tool aims to support response teams to meet requirements in emergencies in the context of practical constraints that usually follow a rapid-onset crisis. The tool is independent of other multi-sectoral assessments and collects information only on EFSL. The results of this initial assessment can be used to inform the design of first phase responses, for the first 6 to 8
