Building Adaptive Capacity and Resilience of Agricultural-based Livelihoods

On May 15, TOPS will host a presentation by Tim Frankenberger, President of Tango International, to discuss the effect of shocks on agricultural-based livelihoods and how these livelihoods can adapt to climate change. He will emphasize the strengthening of adaptive capacity of agricultural and livestock-based livelihood systems, as well as the role of social capital in managing risk. This session is a follow-up to a [previous presentation](#) by Frankenberger examining characteristics of community resilience and community adaptive capacity, as well as the challenges of identifying effective tools for measuring resilience.

The presentation will be held in the Save the Children office in Washington, DC, 2000 L St. NW, Suite 500, Wednesday, May 15, 2013, from 1 - 3 PM. Remote access will be available.
