Behavior Bank Now Available on FSN Network

The Food Security and Nutrition Network <u>Behavior Bank</u> is now online. The bank features results from Barrier Analysis and Doer/NonDoer Studies conducted by food security and other practitioners globally. (<u>click here</u> for a description of Barrier Analysis and resource links.) You can browse the database by country, region, and behavior studied to look for results for a particular area/behavior, or to look for patterns of barriers and enablers for a particular behavior or set of behaviors. We welcome submissions of new studies from the community of practice. Add your own study to the Behavior Bank. Guidance on how to add your study is provided. As people add studies, we hope to map out determinants for key behaviors across countries and regions and learn from those patterns.

FFP Consultation: Changing from Implementation Year to Fiscal Year, RSVP by May 15

USAID's Office of Food for Peace (FFP) would like to hold a consultation with PVO partner representatives on Monday, May 20, 2013, at ACDI/VOCA's office (located at 50 F Street NW, Suite 1075, Washington, DC) from 10-11:30 AM to discuss the possibilities of changing from the use of implementation year to fiscal year only for reporting and budgeting (i.e., resource allocation). Based on preliminary discussions FFP recognizes that this is a complex undertaking that requires partner input including creative brainstorming to make the best decisions for the smoothest transition.

The change from implementation year to fiscal year may affect a variety of items, including but not limited to quarterly reporting, Annual Results Report timing, Pipeline and Resources Estimate Proposal (PREP) submissions and approvals, calls forward, as well as the timing of the Request for Applications and signing of awards.

Feed the Future Agricultural Indicators Guide Webinar Series

USAID's Bureau of Food Security (BFS) is developing a guide for Feed the Future (FTF) agricultural indicators that will focus on four key agricultural indicators, selected because they provide important information on the annual progress of FTF activities in agriculture and also because they present particular challenges in data collection and reporting within the FTF Monitoring System (FTFMS).

This series of webinar provides an opportunity for USG agencies and their implementing partners to provide their input and perspective on the real-life challenges encountered with measurement of:

- 4.5-15 Gross margin per unit of land, kilogram, or animal of selected product
- 4.5.2-5 Number of farmers and others who have applied new technologies or management practices as a result of USG assistance
- 4.5.2-2 Number of hectares under improved technologies or management practices as a result of USG assistance
- 4.5.2-23 Value of incremental sales (collected at farm level) attributed to FTF implementation


From the Online Community: Using Government Paid Community Health Workers As Promoters
