Food For Peace Management Information System (FFPMIS) Update

Given the introduction of the new Food for Peace Management Information System (FFPMIS), FFP has updated the Annual Results Report (ARR) guidance. FFPMIS has been upgraded to include two new modules: ARR and Standardized Annual Program Questionnaire (SAPQ). These new modules are designed to allow for easier and complete reporting on Title II awardees' activities.

Note that AARs for FY 2013 are due on November 4, 2013.
