Alternate Commodity Request Encouraged Due to Green Peas Shortage

Due to a current shortage of green peas (split and whole) in the U.S., Food for Peace strongly encourages Title II implementing partners to identify and request an alternate commodity. The U.S. Dry Pea and Lentil Council advises that the availability of green peas is not expected to improve until the next harvest begins in July/August of 2013. They also indicated that they do not anticipate any supply problems with yellow peas and lentils.

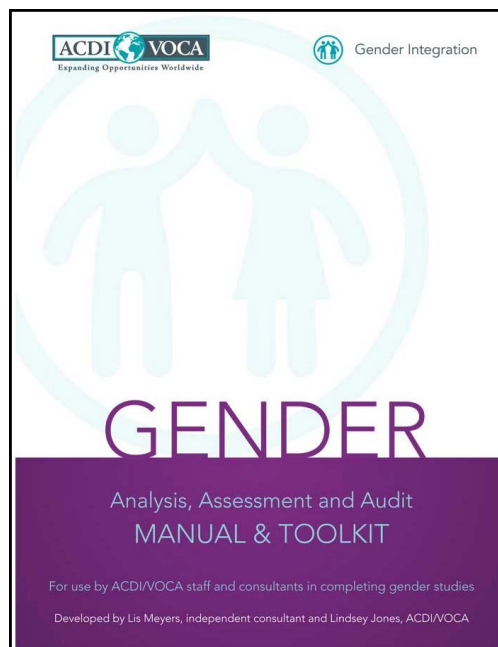
