Draft FY 2014 Request for Applications for Title II Development Food Assistance Programs in Nepal

USAID has released a Fiscal Year 2014 (FY 2014) Draft Request for Applications (RFA) for Title II Development Food Assistance Programs in Nepal.

This draft is being sent out for 45 days to reflect recent changes to FFP authorities as outlined in the Agricultural Act of 2014. The FY 2014 Draft Development Food Assistance Programs comments are due on Friday, May 9th by 11:59 AM EDT.

As this guidance is draft and subject to change, all potential applicants are strongly advised to wait for final guidance before starting to work on an application.

Applications are submitted at the risk of the applicant, and all preparation and submission costs are at the applicant's expense.
