### **Amended FY 2014 Request for Applications for Title II Development Food Assistance Programs**

USAID has released an amended Fiscal Year 2014 (FY 2014) Request for Applications (RFA) for Title II Development Food Assistance Programs in Burundi, Madagascar and Malawi. The country-specific information for Burundi and Madagascar has also been amended. The country specific information for Malawi remains unchanged.

These revisions have been made to reflect recent changes to FFP authorities as outlined in the Agricultural Act of 2014. The FY2014 Development Food Assistance Applications are due on Thursday, April 3rd by 11:59 AM EDT. Applications are submitted at the risk of the applicant, and all preparation and submission costs are at the applicant's expense.
