## SUMMARY OF KEY FINDINGS

In early 2020, the Kore Lavi Strategic Objective 2 (SO2) impact evaluation was discontinued due to the COVID-19 pandemic and heightened insecurity. However, the USAID Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (BHA) seized this unique opportunity to conduct a mixed-methods study in three Kore Lavi communes in the Northwest Department and upper Artibonite Department (Bombardopolis, Mole Saint Nicolas, and Anse Rouge) where data was collected prior to the start of the pandemic. The study looks at the impacts of recent shocks (COVID-19, climatic, social-political) on poor households, ${ }^{1}$ and the capacities and strategies these households have used to mitigate these events.

This study builds on the first round of data collected from 276 households surveyed in January of 2020 by conducting a second round of data collection with the same households in January and February 2021, with the addition of questions related to COVID-19, shocks, and resilience. These two studies provide a panel database of 255 households ( 21 households lost at follow-up).

Additionally, complementary qualitative research was conducted in two phases. Phase 1 was intended to inform hypotheses and modifications to the second round of the quantitative data collection tool. It took place in January and February of 2021 prior to the second round of quantitative data collection. Phase 2 of the qualitative research was conducted in June 2021 after the second round of quantitative data collection to further explore the impacts of COVID-19, other shocks, and resilience of poor households in the study areas. Phase 2 was also meant to better illuminate the quantitative findings.

The study has identified several findings of particular importance to understanding the current food/nutrition security and poverty situation of poor households in the study areas.

## Key Finding 1: Changes in Poverty and Food Security

According to the Integrated Phase Classification (IPC), food security in Haiti has worsened in the past 3 years, with the number of Haitians facing high levels of acute food insecurity nearly doubling between 2018 and 2021. The September 2021-February 2022 IPC indicates, in the communes focused on in this study, Bombardopolis and Mole Saint Nicolas are in Phase 4 (food security emergency), and Anse rouge is in Phase 3 (food security crisis). The cited drivers of poor food security are economic (inflation, reduction in remittances), poor harvests (poor rainfall), hurricane Laura (August 2020, mainly in the southern parts of the country), and the secondary impacts of COVID-19 (lockdowns, restrictions negatively affecting livelihoods).

Between early 2020 (Round 1) and early 2021 (Round 2), the breadth and depth of poverty has increased, with a highly significant shift observed in Anse Rouge. Food security-related outcomes show mixed directions of change between rounds, but in all cases, a very large proportion of households experiencing food insecurity and hunger.

The overall prevalence of households living on less than the equivalent of $\$ 1.90$ per day per capita increased from $81 \%$ to $87 \%$. The greatest increase was observed in Mole Saint Nicholas (from $68 \%$ of

[^0]households in Round 1 to 80\% in Round 2). This increase in poverty is largely due to a significant decrease in the purchasing power of households. The Purchasing Parity Index for Haiti increased by $24 \%$ between 2019 and 2020, resulting in a $34 \%$ increase in the poverty line after accounting for additional inflation in early 2021. Thus, while overall reported expenditures remained largely stable between the two rounds, reported quantities purchased indicated a significant decline in the estimated overall quantity of food consumed per person. These findings are triangulated by the qualitative data, where participants in both phases indicated price increases, with several Phase 2 Focus Group Discussion (FGD) participants reporting the prices of some basic commodities had as much as doubled.

Food security was measured in the quantitative surveys using two different diet-related indicators and one experiential indicator. The Household Dietary Diversity Score (HDDS) measures the diversity of foods consumed within a household during the previous day and is reported as a mean or median value. The Food Consumption Score (FCS) is a measure of diet diversity and the frequency of consumption in the household during the previous 7 days. The resulting FCS is then reported as a prevalence, categorized into three food consumption groups (poor, borderline, and acceptable). The Household Hunger Scale (HHS) measures the perceived experience of hunger in the household over the past month and is reported as a prevalence. The scale is categorized into severe hunger, moderate hunger, and little/no hunger.

Both the HDDS and the FCS showed that diets were poor in both Round 1 and Round 2, with infrequent consumption of fruits, vegetables, and animal proteins. The mean HDDS remained similar between rounds. The prevalence of poor/borderline FCS decreased from $81 \%$ of households in Round 1 to $71 \%$ in Round 2, mainly due to slight increases in consumption frequencies of staples, legumes, and fats. However, the FCS does not account for the actual quantities consumed. Further analysis of the estimates of 7-day food expenditures and quantities purchased revealed that households purchased smaller quantities of vegetables and fats in Round 2. There were no significant differences in the quantities of staples and legumes purchased despite increases in the FCS score for these categories. This suggests that households reporting more frequent consumption are likely consuming smaller quantities per day rather than actually increasing consumption. According to the HHS, the prevalence of households reporting moderate or severe hunger increased from $34 \%$ in Round 1 to $44 \%$ in Round 2.

## Key Finding 2: Perceptions of Impacts of COVID-19

The COVID-19 pandemic was not generally perceived by the key informants (Kis) and FGD participants as a specific shock in itself but rather an aggravating factor that worsens the impacts of other chronic and acute challenges. COVID-19 also lessens the ability of the poor to employ their usual survival strategies.

In both phases of qualitative data collection, all KIs and FGD participants indicated that they were aware of few or no cases of COVID-19 in their areas. Secondary data indicate relatively few confirmed cases in Haiti, and informal sources suggest that cases have been concentrated in urban areas. Qualitative data indicate that remittances coming from elsewhere in Haiti and from abroad have decreased or stopped due to COVID-19. Social support within the communities, in general, has lessened because of social distancing, the closing of churches and schools, and general isolation due to COVID-19 restrictions. In addition, domestic and cross-border travel difficulty has made certain livelihoods more challenging.

Key Finding 3: COVID-19 Precautions and Access to Healthcare
Qualitative data indicate that the population is generally aware of the cause and preventive measures of COVID-19. However, the data also show that the pandemic has had a negative impact on accessing health care.

The qualitative data indicate that people are aware of using masks and social distancing in public to reduce transmission, but few people use masks-generally because of a lack of vigilance or a lack of money to purchase masks.

In Round 2, 20\% of those interviewed indicated that they or someone in their household had delayed/skipped/been unable to complete health care visits in the previous year because of COVID-19. The specific reasons cited included fear of contracting COVID-19 (45\%), lack of money to pay for healthcare ( $29 \%$ ), lack of availability of healthcare (18\%), and fear of being quarantined (4\%). Qualitative data confirms these findings. FGDs and key informant interviews (KIIs) frequently indicate that people have been afraid to seek health care for fear of contracting COVID-19 and the stigma that suspected COVID-19 infection causes. Additionally, in Phase 1 of the qualitative data collection, the fear of being quarantined if seeking care for any COVID-19-like symptoms was a frequently cited concern. This was mentioned less often in the qualitative Phase 2 interviews and discussions.

## Key Finding 4: Impacts of Drought and Poor Water Access/Infrastructure

The impacts of drought (acute and chronic) on agriculture and livestock livelihoods, coupled with the severe lack of water and agriculture infrastructure, such as irrigation, is one of the biggest underlying factors of household food insecurity, poverty, and low resilience in the areas studied.

Drought and drinking/irrigation water access were mentioned as one of/or the most significant shocks/challenges in every qualitative KII and FGD. People are planting less than before (beans, corn, peanuts, potatoes) because of the lack of rain. Disease and lack of forage due to drought have caused significant loss of livestock. Round 2 added specific questions on drinking and irrigation water access. These data indicate that $76 \%$ of households must travel for more than 30 minutes to access drinking water, and $40 \%$ of households must travel for more than 2 hours to access drinking water. Over $40 \%$ of households report getting their drinking water from an unsafe source (mainly surface water and unprotected springs). Approximately $65 \%$ of households reported practicing agriculture in the past year (even if not cited as one of the main livelihoods). Of those, only $6 \%$ reported having access to irrigation (mainly a canal or ditch). The remaining $94 \%$ reported relying only on rainfall.

## Key Finding 5: Agriculture and Other Livelihoods

The use of agriculture as part of the main livelihood strategies is fluid. Although commonly practiced, the evidence indicates that it is not considered a viable or reliable primary source of income. Investments in agriculture in these areas may not improve resilience or reduce poverty unless very large and long-term investments are made in water and irrigation infrastructure.

Those relying solely on agriculture have among the worst food security outcomes, while households with two or more livelihoods were significantly more likely to report adequate food consumption levels. Households are selling off their productive agriculture assets in an attempt to cope with the worsening economic and food security situation. The overall percentage of households owning agricultural equipment declined from $48 \%$ to $10 \%$, with similar significant trends in all three regions. Repeated
drought combined with a lack of agriculture infrastructure, such as irrigation, has further aggravated the challenges in relying on agriculture as a source of food and money. Young people are increasingly looking away from agriculture for other sources of income, such as moto-taxi driving.

## Key Finding 6: Psychological Distress

Psychological distress is high in the surveyed populations, stemming from the challenges related to poverty, COVID-19, and other recent shocks.

Round 2 survey data revealed high rates of psychological stress, with $28 \%$ of respondents scoring 7 or higher on the General Health Questionnaire-12 (GHQ-12). ${ }^{2}$ The prevalence varied significantly by commune, from $15 \%$ of respondents in Anse Rouge to $23 \%$ in Mole Saint Nicholas to $45 \%$ in Bombardopolis. This contrasts with 19\% of respondents experiencing psychological stress in a 2011 national food security survey. Elevated psychological stress was triangulated by the qualitative data, where KIs and FGD participants reported experiencing greater general fear and stress than usual because of the pandemic. There was also clear evidence that psychological distress was associated with poverty. Among those with per capita daily spending above the estimated 2021 poverty line, none showed evidence of severe psychological stress, in contrast to $33 \%$ among the respondents with expenditures below the poverty line. Greater depth of poverty was most closely associated with feelings of depression, low self-worth, low confidence, and an inability to concentrate.

## 1. INTRODUCTION

This section gives an overview of how this study evolved from a previously planned impact evaluation into the current study.

### 1.1. ADAPTING AN IMPACT EVALUATION INTO A COVID-19 IMPACT STUDY (OVERVIEW)

In 2019, under the Implementer-Led Evaluation and Learning (IMPEL) Associate Award, Tulane University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine (Tulane) was subcontracted to conduct a final impact evaluation of Kore Lavi (KL). Kore Lavi is a United States Agency for International Development (USAID) Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (BHA)-funded Resilience Food Security Activity (RFSA) implemented in Haiti by a consortium of partners, led by CARE as prime.

The objective of the quantitative final impact evaluation was to measure the impact of the Kore Lavi activities on food security and poverty of the poorest households targeted by Kore Lavi. The evaluation was designed to determine whether changes in food security and poverty indicators for direct participant households over time are attributable to the Kore Lavi food voucher distributions. The approach for this final impact evaluation was a quasi-experimental design, in which study areas were non-randomly assigned to an intervention or comparison group.

The baseline survey ${ }^{3}$ data collection was conducted between November 2014 and December 2015. The target population and sampling frame for the baseline intervention group was the lowest 11\% of vulnerable households in each commune identified through Kore Lavi's vulnerability analysis. These households later benefited from Kore Lavi's food vouchers for the duration of the project.

The endline survey was planned to take place during the same period (November 2019 to December 2020) to avoid any possible seasonal bias. Rather than take a random sample at the endline from the same sampling frame used at baseline, the sampling frame was limited to only households that were included in the baseline survey, allowing paired pre-post analysis at the household level.

The start of the endline survey data collection was delayed to early 2020 due to ongoing insecurity in Haiti. Data was collected from the first three communes (Bombardopolis and Mole Saint Nicholas in the Northwest Department and Anse Rouge in Artibonite Department) in January and February 2020. All three communes were from the KL intervention areas. A total of 276 households were interviewed in these three areas. ${ }^{4}$

The next planned period of data collection was to take place from May to July of 2020 in a different set of communes. However, due to the developing COVID-19 pandemic at this time, as well as heightened

[^2]insecurity, BHA decided to first postpone and then later cancel the remainder of the data collection and no longer conduct the final impact evaluation.

Once it became evident that data collection in Haiti could be conducted safely if proper COVID-19 protocols were put into place, Tulane and BHA worked together to seize this unique opportunity to build on the data collected from these 276 households in early 2020. They proposed adapting it into a panel study of these households. They would re-interview them again one year later in early 2021 and add complementary qualitative research. Their goal would be to examine the impacts recent shocks (COVID19, climatic, social-political) had on poor households and better understand the capacities and strategies poor households have used to mitigate these events.

These adaptations resulted in the study presented in this report.

### 1.2. STUDY OBJECTIVES AND RESEARCH QUESTIONS

The objectives of the study are to:

- Assess how recent shocks (COVID-19, climatic, social-political) have affected poor households in three communes in the Northwest and Artibonite departments.
- Understand what capacities and strategies they have used to mitigate these events.
- Generate hypotheses about potential resilience capacities and their relationship to the various shocks, including COVID-19.

The study research questions are:

1. How has household food/economic security status changed during the past year as a result of COVID-19 and its sequelae?
2. What shocks have been experienced by activity participant households (socio-political, climatic, COVID-19), and how have they coped with them?
3. What resilient characteristics are present in participant households?

## 2. METHODOLOGY

This study applied mixed methods, employing both qualitative and quantitative data collection as well as a review of existing data and studies related to food security and recent shocks in Haiti. The study was specifically designed to follow both rounds of quantitative data collection with qualitative data collection, each designed to inform the next data collection exercise and to further explore questions that came up in the initial analysis of the previously collected data. A timeline of the study data collection activities and analysis is shown in Figure 1 below.

## Secondary data review, monitoring

The qualitative portion of the study included Focus Group Discussions (FGDs), Key Informant Interviews (KIIs), and a small number of in-depth semi-structured interviews (see selection in the sampling sections). These were used to gather information about perceptions of shock exposure, coping capacities/resilience capacities, and this small sample's perceptions on any resilience capacities that enabled them to cope with shocks, including those related to the COVID-19 pandemic. The qualitative data collection was split into two phases (Phase 1 qualitative and Phase 2 qualitative).

The quantitative component focuses on the 2020/21 panel data, referred to in this report as Round 1 and Round 2. The quantitative portion of the study focused primarily on the changes in household food security and consumption expenditure indicators, coping behaviors and resilience capacities (assessed retrospectively) between early 2020 and early 2021. These changes will be further complemented by data collected at follow-up Round 2 on shocks, coping, resilience, and psychosocial well-being. These additional modules in Round 2 were informed by the Phase 1 qualitative data.

### 2.1. ROUND 1 QUANTITATIVE

As noted above, Round 1 of the quantitative data collection was conducted before the study focus was shifted from an endline survey for the KL impact evaluation to a stand-alone study on the impacts of COVID-19 and other shocks.

### 2.1.1. TOOLS AND INDICATORS

The Round 1 household survey questionnaire was adapted from the Kore Lavi Strategic Objective 2 (SO2) baseline study survey instrument. The questionnaire consists of separate modules for the following topics:

- Module A: Household identification and informed consent.
- Module B: Household roster.
- Module C: Household food diversity and hunger.
- Module H: Household expenditures.

Additional questions on livelihoods and voucher program exposure/other food-security program exposure were also included in the tool

Questions for Modules A through C were adapted using questions from the Food for Peace (FFP) Standard Indicators Handbook and the Demographic and Health Survey (DHS) questionnaire; and questions for Module H from the 2012 Living Standards Measurement Survey.

The key indicators are presented in the Round 2 quantitative data collection section further below.

### 2.1.2. SAMPLING

The 2014 KL baseline survey sample was designed to be representative of the poorest $11 \%$ of households in the surveyed communes, based on the Haitian Deprivation and Vulnerability Index (HDVI), in both KL intervention communes as well as non-KL intervention communes to serve as the comparison group).

To improve comparability between the intervention and comparison area households in the endline, a nearest-neighbor analysis was done using the 2014 baseline data. In the intervention areas, the $10 \%$ of households with the most distant nearest neighbor in the comparison areas were identified. The endline sampling frame then consisted of the remaining $90 \%$ of households interviewed at baseline. A subset of households in each commune was randomly selected from this list to be interviewed in the endline study.

The Round 1 sample of this study consists of those households sampled in three of the nine communes planned to be included for the Kore Lavi endline survey that were able to be interviewed before the pandemic began.

To locate the households for Round 1, the surveyors were given the list of the 2014/15 Kore Lavi baseline survey household information provided to Tulane by BHA. This data included the following information:

- Geographic.
- Commune (sub-department administrative unit).
- Seccion Communal (sub-commune level administrative unit).
- Localite (village/community name).
- GPS coordinates (for some communes).
- Household.
- Names of the household members.
- If possible, the name of the person interviewed in the baseline survey.

The survey team spoke with local residents to identify who in the communities could help identify the selected households based on the above information. If a household was not found, a substitute household from the same localite was randomly selected. If the household was found but nobody was home/available for interview, two to three re-visits were made in an attempt to interview the household. If nobody was found available for an interview, a substitute household within the same localite would be selected.

However, in Round 1, about 45\% of the selected households were not able to be located. In the time between the Kore Lavi SO2 baseline survey and Round 1 data collection in early 2020, they may have moved away, dissolved, or the survey teams simply could not locate them with the available information. These households were replaced with the nearest households that had taken part in the Kore Lavi SO2 baseline survey. Ultimately, 276 households were interviewed across the three communes in Round 1.

An analysis was conducted to look for bias in the R1 sample. Using baseline data on food security outcomes and basic household demographics, no evidence of meaningful bias was observed in the subset sampled in R1 and those not sampled. ${ }^{5}$

These modifications to the sample (exclusion through nearest neighbor analysis, and large proportion of replacement households) render it technically non-probable, and so not statistically representative of the poorest $11 \%$ of households in the communes. However, the lack of evidence of meaningful bias in food security outcomes and basic household demographics make the data still amenable to statistical tests. However, the results should not be considered representative of the poorest $11 \%$ of households in the three communes, but rather indicative of these households.

### 2.1.3. TRAINING AND FIELDWORK

The training for the first round of quantitative data collection took place in January 2020.
Tulane's local research partner, IFOS, was responsible for the coordination and fieldwork of the data collection. Tulane supported IFOS in the enumerator training, pre-testing before the start of fieldwork, and conducted regular data quality checks throughout the data collection period.

Training took place at the IFOS office conference room in Port-au-Prince. Enumerators traveled to Port-au-Prince to take part in the training. The training was co-led by the Tulane survey expert, IFOS supervisor, and an IFOS hired consultant that had technical knowledge and experience on the collection and analysis of consumption/expenditure survey data in Haiti. The training lasted 6 days, including the pre-test.

[^3]For training and field guidance, manuals and guidelines were adapted from the baseline survey:

1. Supervisor and interviewer manuals include topics such as objectives of study, survey organization, supervisor roles and responsibilities, rules and regulations, ethics, and quality control. Guidelines for implementing survey and fieldwork procedures, including interviewing techniques and procedures for completing the questionnaires.
2. Question by question detailed explanations includes detailed explanations and instructions for each question in the questionnaire.

The Phase 1 field data collection was conducted by one team, made up of seven members: one team leader and six enumerators. The team leader and the survey coordinator at IFOS conducted field supervision. Additionally, IFOS hired an expert in consumption-expenditure survey data collection and analysis in Haiti (Haitian national) to assist in the training and serve as an independent monitor of the fieldwork. Tulane staff conducted overall supervision remotely, including regular checks of the data quality.

Data was collected using tablets and smartphones, programmed using Open Data Kit (ODK), which allowed skip patterns and data range checks to be automatically embedded in the application, as well as real-time monitoring of the data quality. Data checks were included.

- Checking the sample: validating interviewed households against the sample (comparison of household member names, locations) and verifying the correct unique household ID numbers were applied to ensure data from baseline and Round 1 were aligned.
- Checking data integrity: verifying unique IDs, comparing data-to-data dictionary of expected values, verifying labels, and checking values to ensure they fall within the valid range.
- Checks of data validity: verifying that skip patterns were correctly observed, no unexpected missing data points, excessive use of "don't know" or "other," and distributions of continuous measures to identify outliers.

In Round 1, only four households required corrections to their unique IDs. These were all in replacement households, where the enumerator recorded the originally sampled household ID rather than the replacement household ID. Field supervisors kept records of all households that were replaced, so the IDs were also verified against this list. Additionally, enumerators validated that the household interviewed had received Kore Lavi vouchers. Only one household reported they had not received KL vouchers. This household was replaced following field protocol.

### 2.2. PHASE 1 QUALITATIVE

The goal of the first round of qualitative data collection was to gain a basic understanding of the perceptions and main effects of COVID-19 and other recent shocks on the poor households in the communities being studied. This study also informed adaptations to the quantitative survey tool used in Round 2 (early 2021).

### 2.2.1. OBJECTIVES AND TOOLS

Objectives of Phase 1 qualitative:

- To better understand how COVID-19 is perceived by the population (as a shock, as an issue not impacting their communities, etc.), how they understand the effects of COVID-19, the impacts on their lives/livelihoods, and how they have responded to these impacts.
- To understand the changes in household resilience over the past 5 years, including farming practices, spending habits and other characteristics, and what projects may have helped build household resilience.
- To help inform the next steps of the data collection as part of the assessment on the impacts of the Coronavirus pandemic and other recent shocks on the poor households in the areas being studied.

The interview guide for Phase 1 Qualitative is found in Annex A.

### 2.2.2. SAMPLE SIZE AND SELECTION

In Phase 1 of the qualitative data collection, 15 key informant interviews (KIIs) were conducted, with a total of 16 key informants (KIs) (one interview was done with two informants together). Five interviews were conducted in each of the three communes. KIs included staff from the Mayor's office, local leaders or "notab," health workers, community development council members, community organization members, and small merchants. These key informants were identified by IFOS based on their contacts, drawing from the contacts used in the mid-term evaluation qualitative data collection.

### 2.2.3. TRAINING AND FIELDWORK

The training for the first phase of qualitative data collection took place January 9-10, 2021. Tulane participated virtually (via Zoom), and IFOS led the in-country training and the practice sessions with the field interviewers. Tulane also held calls with the IFOS staff and the survey coordinator before, during, and after the training to ensure they had a full understanding of the methodology, tools, and purposes of the data collection.

Data collection took place from January 11 to January 15, 2021. There were four field team members. They worked in pairs, with one note taker and one interviewer. The interviews were audio-recorded after securing a verbal informed consent from the participant(s), and the teams took extensive notes during and after each interview which were used to prepare a separate report for each interview.

IFOS supervised fieldwork remotely (from Port-au-Prince). The survey coordinator also served in the field as one of the interviewers. Tulane remained in contact with the teams on a regular basis via WhatsApp. After the first day of interviews, Tulane held a phone call with the team leader to get initial insights on findings so that Tulane could provide feedback, such as additional lines of inquiry, clarifications of any of the tools, and discussion of the KI selection to ensure various information sources and viewpoints were accounted for.

### 2.3. ROUND 2 QUANTITATIVE

### 2.3.1. TOOLS AND INDICATORS

The second round of follow-up household data collection used the Round 1 questionnaire with only small modifications designed to address lines of query identified in Phase 1 of the qualitative and to assess the impacts of COVID-19 and other shocks. Modules added to the Round 2 tool include:

- General shock exposure and coping.
- COVID-19 specific shock exposure and coping.
- Perceptions of COVID-19 impacts (general, on livelihoods, on food access).
- Access and use of credit.
- COVID-19 knowledge, attitude, and practice.
- Psychosocial well-being.

The household roster module was abbreviated in Round 2. The food security and consumption/ expenditure modules remained unchanged from Round 1.

The quantitative survey instruments are found in Annex B.
The quantitative survey instruments gathered a wide range of data. Key indicators focused on in the analysis include, but are not limited to, those in the list below. Indicators added to the Round 2 quantitative data collection are noted.

## Food Security Outcomes:

- Household Hunger Score (HHS).
- Food Consumption Score (FCS) and Food Consumption Score Groups.
- Household Dietary Diversity between Jan/Feb 2020 and the date of survey implementation.


## Economic Security Outcomes:

- Prevalence of poverty (below $\$ 1.90$ per capita per day).
- Depth of poverty.


## Other high-level outcomes:

- Psychosocial well-being status-General Health Questionnaire 12 (GHQ-12). (Round 2 only).


## Other key indicators:

- Access to healthcare (Round 2 only).
- Livelihoods.
- Agricultural assets (Additional data in Round 2 only).
- Drinking and irrigation water access (Round 2 only).


## Coronavirus Specific measures:

- Knowledge, Attitude, Practice (KAP) related to Coronavirus (Round 2 only).
- Coronavirus specific shocks/coping (Round 2 only).

Additionally, data from other modules was analyzed, and used to describe household characteristics and practices to further describe resilient characteristics where possible.

### 2.3.2. SAMPLING

To conserve the panel design, the same 276 households surveyed in Round 1 (January/February 2020) were targeted to be re-interviewed in Round 2 (February 2021). Initial discussions with the local research partner (IFOS) indicated a strong likelihood that they would be able to locate these households for interview. As seen in the table below, of the 276 households interviewed in Round 1, 92\% (255 households) were located and consented to be interviewed in Round 2.

### 2.3.3. TRAINING AND FIELDWORK

Because of the restrictions due to COVID-19, the team size for the Round 2 quantitative data collection was reduced to four enumerators and one supervisor. Training took place in Port-au-Prince, with Tulane supporting remotely. Because IFOS's staff had the experience from Round 1, the training was considered a "refresher," with a focus on the new or modified indicators as well as the additional COVID-19 safety protocols.

As in Round 1, data was collected using tablets and smartphones, programmed using ODK, which allowed skip patterns and data range checks to be automatically embedded in the application, as well as real-time monitoring of the data quality. The same data checks as described in the Round 1 training and fieldwork section were conducted. The sample check was conducted against the Round 1 data, verifying the names, locations, and unique IDs of all Round 2 interviewed households against the Round 1 data to ensure all household data was correctly aligned.

### 2.4. PHASE 2 QUALITATIVE

Phase 2 of qualitative data collection took place after Round 2 quantitative was complete, and initial data analysis had taken place to explore any new questions or unanswered questions that came out of the preliminary quantitative findings.

The primary data collection modality shifted from KIls to FGDs in Phase 2. The participants of the FGDs were primarily (though not exclusively) the same households that had been eligible to participate in the quantitative-namely, households that had benefited from food vouchers during the Kore Lavi
implementation. Additionally, a few KIls were also conducted (see the rationale in the sampling section below).

### 2.4.1. OBJECTIVES AND TOOLS

The research questions and priorities for the Phase 2 qualitative included:

1. Triangulation of household survey results and exploration of underlying causes. Specifically:
a. Loss of assets (farm equipment in particular).
b. Changes in livelihoods (particularly agriculture).
c. Changes in food consumption patterns and sources.
d. Other expenditure changes- related to soap/hygiene products, school/education, medical consultations, etc. including reasons for changes.
2. Triangulation and further interrogation from Phase 1 qualitative findings. Specifically:
a. Perceptions/false information related to COVID-19 and impacts on accessing health care services.
b. Severity of the COVID-19 related shock- perceptions, comparison with the severity of other recent shocks.
c. Further information on drinking and irrigation water access.

The tool for the Phase 2 qualitative data collection (found in Annex A) was adapted from the Phase 1 tool. Additional questions/discussion points were made to gather information related to:

- Probes to better understand the impacts on seeking healthcare/visiting health care facilities (as had come up in Phase 1).
- Specific discussion points related to other shocks and difficulties, looking back over a 2-year recall period. Probes to determine the perceptions of the severity of the COVID-19 shock vs. other shocks.
- More directed discussion points related to changes in livelihoods and assets to triangulate and better understand the findings in the preliminary analysis of Round 2 household data, where households reported shifting away from agriculture and selling agricultural assets.
- Probes related to dietary changes at the household level.

Following discussions with IFOS on the Phase 2 tools, an additional document was developed to outline research questions and priorities for the Phase 2 data collection, so that the FGD leaders would be better equipped to lead the discussions as well as prepare the reports from each of the FGD guides. This guide is found in Annex $A$.

### 2.4.2. SAMPLING

For the Phase 2 qualitative data collection, the sample consisted of 12 FGDs (four per commune), as well as four KIIs with a total of eight key informants. FGD participants were identified through discussion with local leaders, identifying past KL participant households from the communities targeted. KIs were primarily local merchants, identified in large part through previous contacts made in the communes by IFOS during the KL qualitative evaluation (2019). These merchants had, in large part, participated in the KL food voucher activity (as recipients of the vouchers in payment for local fresh foods). One BAC (Communal Agricultural extension office) staff member in each commune was also targeted for
interviews to gain further insight into the issues that had come up in Phase 1 of the qualitative and in the analysis of the quantitative data related to challenges with agriculture, drought, and water access. However, the team was only able to interview one.

### 2.4.3. TRAINING AND FIELDWORK

At the time of the qualitative Phase 2 training and fieldwork, Haiti was experiencing another wave of COVID-19 infections, although reported infections remained relatively uncommon in the areas of the study. To further decrease the risks, the decision was made to reduce the field data collection teams to just two people. These were both more senior-level IFOS staff with extensive experience in qualitative data collection. As such, the training for Phase 2 was conducted as a workshop with the IFOS data collectors to refine the discussion guides. This workshop also resulted in an additional guidance document better describing in more detail the underlying goals of the various sections of the discussion guides. The training for qualitative Phase 2 took place between June 19 and 21, with the IFOS staff in their office in Port-au-Prince and Tulane working with them virtually through zoom calls, WhatsApp texts and calls, and email.

Data collection took place between June 23 and 28, 2021. The two team members worked as a pair when required (for example, when larger FGDs required a separate note-taker). They worked individually when conducting smaller FGDs and KIIs. The interviews and FGDs were audio-recorded after securing a verbal informed consent from the participant(s), and the field data collectors also took extensive notes during and after each interview which were used to prepare a separate report for each interview.

Because the field data collectors were senior IFOS staff, support from the Port-au-Prince office was mainly logistical. As with Phase 1, Tulane remained in contact with the team on a regular basis via WhatsApp. After the first 2 days of fieldwork, a phone call was held with the team leader to get initial insights on findings so that Tulane could provide feedback such as additional lines of inquiry,
clarifications of any of the tools, and discussion of the FGD and KI selection to ensure various information sources and viewpoints were accounted for.

### 2.5. COVID-19 PROTOCOLS AND ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS

Field procedures for Round 2 of the quantitative and both phases of the qualitative were adapted with COVID-19 safety mitigation protocols at every stage of data collection to mitigate the risk of the virus transmission and safeguard the wellbeing of staff, households, and communities.

The underlying principle guiding the adaptations to the data collection procedures is "Do No Harm." Per the USAID/FFP and USAID/Office of U.S. Foreign Disaster Assistance Interim Guidance for Applicants Engaging in COVID-19 Humanitarian Response: in all programming, the safety and security of community members and implementing partner staff are critical; and where remote monitoring is not feasible, update data collection tools and protocols to limit proximity, frequency, and duration of face-to-face contact.

Key protocol points were identified ahead of training and fieldwork in collaboration with IFOS. This protocol considered the Haitian Government's regulations and restrictions related to COVID-19. Additionally, Tulane University prepared research protocols for home research visits under COVID-19 conditions. The detailed protocol points and Tulane's research protocol document are found in Annex C.

Ethics approval has been granted from the Tulane Institutional Review Board, as well as the Haitian Comite National de Bioethique housed at the Ministry of Health for the initial quantitative data collection.

### 2.6. DATA ANALYSIS (QUANTITATIVE)

The analysis of pandemic impacts requires a multi-faceted approach. As noted by Madhav et al (2017): ${ }^{6}$
"The direct fiscal impacts of pandemics generally are small, however, relative to the indirect damage to economic activity and growth. Negative economic growth shocks are driven directly by labor force reductions caused by sickness and mortality and indirectly by fear-induced behavioral changes. Fear manifests itself through multiple behavioral changes. As an analysis of the economic impacts of the 2014 West Africa Ebola epidemic noted, 'Fear of association with others . . . reduces labor force participation, closes places of employment, disrupts transportation, motivates some governments to close land borders and restrict entry of citizens from affected countries, and motivates private decision makers to disrupt trade, travel, and commerce by canceling scheduled commercial flights and reducing shipping and cargo services' (Jonas, $2013^{7}$ ). These effects reduce labor force participation over and above the pandemic's direct morbidity and mortality effects and constrict local and regional trade."

[^4]The panel design, particularly when coupled with the qualitative and secondary data contextualization, affords the opportunity to better understand the interactions between COVID impacts related to personal income, infrastructure and social services, market disruptions, and behavioral changes. Considering that all the survey participants live in extreme poverty, the construction of standard resilience indicators is unlikely to provide meaningful insights. However, the nuanced analysis of which COVID-19 impacts are most relevant to the respondents' well-being based on their pre-pandemic experience is an important outcome of this study.

Daily per capita spending for food, non-food items, durable assets, and housing, which forms the basis for poverty estimates, was computed as described in Appendix A of the Baseline Data Treatment and Analysis Plan, with a few modifications to account for small sample sizes:

- Depreciation rates for assets owned by fewer than 20 households were estimated using the overall median estimated depreciation rate.
- Annual rental value for homes was set to $20 \%$ of the stated property value, based on the average for the few respondents reporting both the property value and rental value for their homes. For owned households with no stated property value, the estimated annual rental expense was set to the median value for actual rents reported.

Analysis was done in SPSS and R. Although the design was not meant to be representative at the population sub-population level, the data may be considered indicative of the poorest $11 \%$ of households in the three communes. All statistical tests should be interpreted with this caveat in mind (see additional information on this in Section 1.1.1 on sampling for Round 1).

### 2.7. DATA ANALYSIS (QUALITATIVE)

Both phases of the qualitative data collection used similar data preparation and analysis approaches. Interviews and FGDs were audio-recorded (after securing informed consent). The interviewers from IFOS took extensive notes both during and after each interview/FGD and then prepared reports based on their notes consisting of quotes, summary statements, and other key information. In Phase 1, the notetakers wrote in Creole, and the reports were submitted in Creole with English translations (translations done by IFOS). In Phase 2, because of the more complex and in-depth nature of the interviews, notetakers wrote in Creole, and the reports were prepared and submitted to Tulane in French. The total report data in Phase 1 was approximately 50 pages.

For the analysis, Tulane reviewed all notes and report materials submitted by IFOS and then summarized the data by theme (those pre-identified, as well as additional themes/sub-themes that emerged from the data, as described below). The analysis attempted to identify commonly occurring discussion points across KIIs and FGDs, as well as points that were made only rarely or once but were of particularly important or relevant insight. The analysis also pulled out relevant quotes from the KIIs and FGD participants that were illustrative of the key findings.

Many of the larger themes were defined ahead of data collection (deductively) in both phases of qualitative data collection. These themes included:

- COVID-19 knowledge, attitude, practice.
- COVID-19 Impacts on household wellbeing.
- Other shocks/difficulties in previous 2 years.
- Changes in household resilience in previous 2 years.

Additionally, several themes were also identified salient issues that came out of the data (inductively) but were not fully pre-defined.

These themes included:

- Impacts of COVID-19 on seeking healthcare/visiting health care facilities.
- Impacts of COVID-19 on social activities/interactions and social capital, and feelings of stress/worry.
- Perceptions of the severity of COVID-19 vs. other shocks.
- Changes in livelihoods, assets, and food consumption/diet due to:
- COVID-19.
- Drought/water access issues.
- Price increases/inflation.
- Discontinuation of the KL vouchers.
- Perceptions of agriculture as a livelihood (related to drought/water access).

Virtual meetings were also conducted after the end of the field data collection with the IFOS field teams to discuss the emerging themes and findings and to gather further insight on the "feeling" of the discussions and responses. This also allowed us to gather further information from observations made by the IFOS field team outside of the interviews. For example, the quality of the living conditions of the local population, the state of the markets in general, and the overall demeanor of the participants and communities in general, which provided additional valuable insight.

### 2.8. LIMITATIONS AND DELIMITATIONS

The results of this study should be interpreted in light of a few key limitations (factors outside the study's scope of influence) and delimitations (factors that the study team agreed to accept even if less than ideal). These include:

- The small panel sample of households (255 with both rounds of quantitative data collection) may limit some analysis, particularly when disaggregating results.
- The attrition between Rounds 1 and 2 was small (about $7.5 \%$ were lost to follow-up in Round 2), slightly reducing the sample size. Attrition households between rounds were not replaced as they would not have data from the first round of the panel study.
- The sample consists of only KL participants, who were identified as the poorest $11 \%$ of households, and from only three communes in the Northwest/Artibonite departments. Furthermore, the sample for this study was modified by the purposive exclusion of $10 \%$ of households from the sampling frame following the nearest-neighbor analysis, and the replacement of a significant portion of sampled households that were not able to be located in Round 1. As such, this data cannot be considered representative of the poorest $11 \%$ of households in the three studied communes.
- However, analysis of baseline data did not show evidence of significant bias between the sampled and unsampled households in Round 1, so the data may be considered indicative of the larger population. Statistical tests used in this report are useful for the interpretation of findings but should be considered only with these caveats in mind.
- The original study was designed around a different set of objectives. Modifications were made to the quantitative tool to adapt it to the revised objectives, but these were only applied in Round 2 of the survey data collection.


## 3. OVERVIEW OF FOOD SECURITY, SHOCKS, AND COVID-19 IN HAITI (2018-PRESENT)

Haiti has historically suffered from very high poverty levels, as measured by socio-economic indicators such as levels of undernourishment, stunting, and underweight children, coupled with poor performance in gross domestic product. Haiti was ranked $169^{\text {th }}$ out of 189 countries on the United Nations 2018 Human Development Index. ${ }^{8}$ The Global Hunger Index (GHI) for 2018 ranks Haiti 113 out of 119 countries, with "alarming" levels of undernourishment, child wasting, child stunting, and child mortality. ${ }^{9}$ Chronic food insecurity is also a significant challenge for Haiti. Almost one-third of Haiti's population is considered food insecure. ${ }^{10}$ Moreover, the high incidence of climatic shocks, environmental hazards, and the government's limited capacity to mitigate risks or respond to disasters further impedes the country's ability to improve opportunities for socio-economic development. As a result, a majority of the Haitian population still faces significant challenges in all four pillars of food security: availability, access, utilization, and stability.

Between 2018 and the present, Haiti has suffered from numerous climatic, political, economic, food security, and COVID-19 related shocks.

### 3.1. COVID-19

On March 16, 2020, during the first weeks of the pandemic, Haiti's prime minister announced a 2-week suspension of flights from Europe, Canada, the Dominican Republic, and Latin America. However, the first two COVID-19 cases in Haiti were confirmed on March 19, 2021. Soon after the first confirmed COVID-19 related death in Haiti on April 9, the Government of Haiti closed schools, factories, and enacted other restrictions in an attempt to limit the spread. The initial lockdown period lasted approximately 5 months for schools (required closing), 3 months of workplace partial or total lockdowns, 3 months of closed borders, and multiple months-long stretches of stay-at-home orders of varying degrees.

Haiti has experienced four distinct waves of new infections: May/June/July 2020, January/February 2021, June/July 2021, and September/October 2021. Currently, it is estimated that there have been approximately 24,000 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Haiti, and 671 deaths. Cases were mostly found in Port-au-Prince, as seen by the higher percentage of total cases in the Ouest Department in Table 3 below, as well as other urban centers, according to informal sources. As of October 1, 2021, only $0.2 \%$ of Haitians had been fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and $0.4 \%$ had received at least one dose. ${ }^{11}$

### 3.2. OTHER SHOCKS

From 2018 to the present, Haiti has been battered by many other shocks, including climatic, political, economic, and other natural disasters:

- Haiti has been experiencing one of its worst outbreaks of violence since 1986. Due to insecurity, 2018 and 2019 were marked by lockdowns across the country. There has been a significant upswing in gang violence, which has impeded travel between regions of Haiti.
- Fuel shortages in 2018 led to fuel prices going up by $50 \%$. This started when Venezuela stopped shipping oil to Haiti in March 2018, and later the removal of government subsidies on fuel in July of 2018.
- From September through November 2019, insecurity kept an estimated 3 million children out of schools. This was resolved just before the COVID-19 pandemic led to another five months of school shutdowns.
- Hurricane Laura, in August 2020, was the strongest hurricane to hit Haiti since 1856.
- Below-average rainfall was recorded between April and May 2021 in almost all of Haiti, resulting in low agricultural production.
- President Moise was assassinated on July 7, 2021, with subsequent political upheaval.
- A major earthquake struck southern Haiti on August 14, 2021, followed shortly after by tropical depression Grace.


### 3.3. ECONOMIC INSTABILITY

The COVID-19 pandemic together with the other significant shocks Haiti has experienced in the past years have had strong negative economic implications for Haiti. The COVID-related lockdowns and restrictions had a negative effect on the local economy and household's livelihoods. Economic decline, stemming from COVID-19 impacts as well as other shocks, is marked by inflation, exchange rate deterioration with the United States Dollar (USD), and a reduction in remittances.

The graph below shows the Consumer Price Index (CPI) in Haiti for food, the general CPI between January 2018 and March 2021. It can be observed that in just over 3 years, the indices had nearly doubled, and that food prices were rising faster than overall prices during this time frame. During this time, purchasing power parity (PPP) ${ }^{13}$ increased from 34 in 2018 to 48 in 2020. ${ }^{14}$

### 3.4. FOOD SECURITY

The shocks described in the above sections have caused a significant deterioration of the food security situation in Haiti from 2018 to the present. Looking at the integrated phase classifications (IPC) over the past three years, the number of Haitians facing high levels of acute food insecurity has nearly doubled, now affecting nearly half the population.

The most recent IPC analysis, ${ }^{16}$ which looks at the period from September 2021 to February 2022, indicates that around 4.3 million people ( $44 \%$ of the population) will experience high levels of acute food insecurity (IPC Phase 3 or above), with about 1.3 million people ( $14 \%$ of the population) IPC Phase 4 , and nearly 3 million people ( $30 \%$ of the population in IPC Phase 3 . Two of the three communes surveyed in this study are classified as IPC Phase 4 (Bombardopolis and Mole Saint Nicolas in the Northwest Department). Anse Rouge (in Artibonite Department) is classified as Phase 3.

[^8]The previous IPC analysis, ${ }^{17}$ published in August of 2020, indicates that $41 \%$ of the population are facing high acute food insecurity (Phases 3 and 4) and are in urgent need of action, with nearly 1 million in IPC Phase 4 (emergency), and 3 million in IPC Phase 3 (crisis). At that time, all three communes in this study were classified as IPC Phase 3. The 2021 IPC analysis cites four main key drivers of the poor food security situation in Haiti:

- Economic decline: inflation, exchange rate deterioration with the USD, and reduction in remittances.
- Poor harvests following below-average rainfall.
- Hurricane Laura (landfall on August 20, 2020), the strongest hurricane to hit Haiti since 1856.
- The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, including the negative impacts lockdowns and restrictions have had on the local economy and family's livelihoods.

Prior to the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the situation was already challenging for Haiti. The October 2019 IPC analysis ${ }^{19}$ indicated that approximately $35 \%$ of the population was already in IPC Phase 3 or 4. The analysis cited the causes of the deteriorating food security situation as rising food prices (annual inflation of about $23 \%$ ), depreciation of the gourde against the dollar, socio-political unrest, and the worsening security situation. Additionally, a drought that lasted from 2018 into the first half of 2019 negatively impacted agricultural production in many parts of the country. This deteriorating environmental situation must be taken into consideration when assessing the food and nutrition security situation.

The 2018-2019 IPC analysis indicates that two of the three communes surveyed in this study saw their IPC phase increase from Phase 2 to Phase 4 (Bombardopolis and Mole Saint Nicolas in the Northwest Department). Anse Rouge (in Artibonite Department) was classified as Phase 3 during the 2 -year period.

## 4. RESULTS

Considering the unique nature of this study, and the breadth of data collected in the two rounds of quantitative and two phases of qualitative, the sections here are laid out to focus on the key findings that emerged from review and analysis of collected data.

### 4.1. CHANGES IN POVERTY AND FOOD SECURITY

## "We spent more because of the increase in product prices ... the prices of basic necessities are doubled. We eat less today because we don't have the money to eat our fill."

Women's FGD, June 2021
The two quantitative rounds used several indicators to measure food and economic security. These include:

- Poverty and economic security indicators:
- Prevalence of poverty.
- Depth of poverty.
- Food security status indicators:
- Household Hunger Score (HHS).
- Food Consumption Score (FCS) and Food Consumption Score Groups (FCGs).
- Household Dietary Diversity (HDDS).


### 4.1.1. POVERTY

The overall prevalence of households living on less than the equivalent of $\$ 1.90$ per day per capita increased from $81 \%$ to $87 \%$ overall, with the greatest increase observed in Mole Saint Nicholas (from $68 \%$ of households in Round 1 to 80\% in Round 2, see Figure 6). This shift was not statistically significant, either overall or at the communal level, due to the small numbers of households that transitioned either into or out of poverty status based on the $\$ 1.90$ threshold (20 and 6, respectively).

The extremely high prevalence of poverty is largely due to a significant decrease in the purchasing power of households. The Purchasing Parity Index for Haiti increased by 24\% between 2019 and 2020, resulting in a $34 \%$ increase in the poverty line after accounting for additional inflation in early 2021. Thus, while overall reported expenditures remained largely stable between the two rounds, reported quantities purchased indicated a significant decline in the estimated overall quantity of food consumed per person.

The depth of poverty is defined as the proportion of the poverty line that is not met by per capita daily consumption. For example, a household with estimated per capita daily consumption of $\$ 1.00$ per day, which is $53 \%$ of the $\$ 1.90$ poverty line, would have a corresponding depth of poverty value of 0.47. Median levels for Round 1 were 0.55 overall, with significant variability by commune ( 0.39 in Anse Rouge, 0.70 in Bombardopolis, and 0.39 in Mole Saint Nicholas). The overall median significantly increased to 0.64 in Round 2 ( $p=0.001$, Wilcoxon test), primarily driven by a sharp increase in Anse Rouge (median 0.6374, p < 0.001) with non-significant increases to 0.74 and 0.42 in Bombardopolis and Mole Saint Nicholas, respectively (see figure below).

These findings are triangulated by the qualitative data, where participants in both phases indicated price increases. In several Phase 2 FGDs, participants pointed out that prices of some staples had as much as doubled. As a result, they often reported modifying their food consumption to buy the cheapest foods and buying food on credit. In an FGD discussion in Anse Rouge, the participants indicated they do not have the ability to sell possessions to cope with the increased prices because they no longer have any possessions to sell.

### 4.1.2. FOOD SECURITY

The prevalence of poor/borderline food consumption score decreased from $81 \%$ of households in round 1 to $71 \%$ in Round 2, mainly due to slight increases in consumption frequencies of staples, legumes, and fats.

Overall food consumption improved slightly from Round 1 to Round 2, with the median FCS score increasing by 5 points ( $p<0.001$, Wilcoxon test). In Anse Rouge, the FCS category (severely low consumption, moderately low consumption, or adequate consumption) improved for 28 of 83 households from Round 1 to Round 2 and declined for 12 ( $p=0.004$, Fisher's Exact Test), and consumption similarly improved for 37 of 85 households in Mole Saint Nicholas while declining for 13 ( $p=0.002$ ). However, there was no significant shift in Bombardopolis, where nearly $50 \%$ of the households remained in severe food insecurity in both Rounds.

Despite the gains in FCS categories, less than half of the households reported any consumption of vegetables, animal proteins, dairy, fruit, or sugar in either round. As indicated by Figure 8, FCS score improvements were primarily due to increases in the frequencies of consumption of staples and legumes, while a small number of households (29) increased both dairy and sugar consumption.

Because the FCS does not account for the actual quantities consumed, analysis of the actual estimates of 7-day food expenditures and quantities purchased provides some additional insights. As illustrated in Figure 10 below, which shows the distributions of the middle $75 \%$ of households for quantities purchased (in grams) and expenditures (in GD), households purchased smaller quantities of vegetables and fats despite spending equivalent amounts, and there were no significant differences in the quantities of staples and legumes purchased despite increases in the FCS score for these categories. This suggests that households reporting more frequent consumption are likely consuming smaller quantities per day rather than actually increasing consumption. This is especially notable for vegetables, where the median per capita quantity purchased for households reporting daily consumption declined from 1,528 grams to 111 grams, a 93\% decrease.

Not surprisingly, these minimal shifts resulted in little change to the HDDS distribution between rounds. In Round 1, the overall median HDDS score was 3 but varied by commune ( 3 in Anse Rouge, 2 in Bombardopolis, and 4 in Mole Saint Nicholas). Overall, there was a net increase of 24 households that attained at least a score of 3 in Round 2 ( $p=0.02$, McNemar's test), but these were not sizable enough to be statistically significant at the regional level. Diets remained nutritionally poor, with infrequent consumption of fruits, vegetables, and animal proteins.

Qualitative data also indicate there have been changes in food consumption habits due to recent shocks. In Phase 2, several FGDs indicated that they were eating smaller quantities of food because of higher prices, as well as less preferred and cheaper foods. One Phase 2 FGD participant in Bombardopolis described it well, saying:
"We eat less because of rising prices. There is a lot of difference in the way of eating because the products are expensive, and we have no gardens. We buy tubers at the market that come from other neighboring towns. And the merchant comes from another town, he increases the price even more because he has to take into account the price of transport as well."

In Round 2, 76\% of households reported not having any access to credit in the past year. These households also have significantly worse food security (FCS) and greater levels of poverty than the households that do have access to credit. Several FGDs in Phase 2 also brought up issues with savings and credit, most frequently citing Village Savings and Loan Associations (VSLAs) (these were strongly and successfully promoted under Kore Lavi). Some discussions of VSLAs cited them as helpful sources of credit, but others highlighted the fact that they no longer have sufficient money to participate due to rising prices. Some also indicated that after the end of the Kore Lavi vouchers, they no longer had the resources to participate in VSLAs. One FGD indicated that people in their community had lost money participating in VSLAs, as some members who had borrowed money could not pay it back.

Despite the apparent improvements in consumption, there was a small but significant increase in the prevalence of moderate or severe hunger (as measured by the HHS indicator), which rose from $34 \%$ in Round 1 to 44\% in Round 2. The percentage of households with severe HHS scores (5-6) showed little change ( $16 \%$ in Round 1 vs. $14 \%$ in Round 2). However, $23 \%$ of households shifted from low or moderate hunger scores into severe hunger, while only $14 \%$ with severe hunger scores in Round 1 had improved scores in Round 2. The most significant shift was observed among the households in Bombardopolis, where the median score increased by a full point (note that an increase in the HHS score indicates worse (increased) levels of hunger.

### 4.2. PERCEPTIONS OF THE IMPACTS OF COVID-19

"Coronavirus has been of an issue that just aggravates other bigger problems" KII, January 2021

Qualitative data from both phases indicate that the populations in the areas studied do not generally perceive COVID-19 pandemic as a specific shock in itself. Instead, it is an aggravating factor that worsens the impacts of other chronic and acute challenges, and lessens the ability of the poor to employ their usual survival strategies.

In both phases of qualitative data collection, all KIs and FGD participants indicated that they were aware of few or no cases of COVID-19 in their areas. However, while the impacts of other shocks and challenges were generally considered more serious, in the Phase 2 FGDs, people often spoke about the fear they had of COVID-19, as it was something new and unknown. Many of the KIs and FGD participants reported experiencing general fear and stress because of the pandemic. As one FGD participant in Bombardopolis put it, "The coronavirus is more serious [than other shocks] because it can kill."

Key informants and FGD participants frequently cited that remittances coming from elsewhere in Haiti and from abroad have decreased or stopped due to COVID-19 and that social support within the communities, in general, has lessened because of social distancing, the closing of churches and schools, and the general isolation due to COVID-19 restrictions. Furthermore, difficulty in domestic and crossborder travel has made certain livelihoods more difficult. FGDs frequently cited buying products on credit to re-sell and doing laundry as common coping strategies that were disrupted by COVID-19 because of the social distancing measures and lockdowns.

Although direct health impacts of COVID-19 remained rare in the study areas, the respondents in Round 2 of the quantitative were still aware of the future direct risk to health that COVID-19 presented, expressing this frequently as a concern. When they were asked what their main concerns related to the effects of COVID-19 were, $63 \%$ cited health concerns, and $29 \%$ cited lack of money. $49 \%$ of respondents indicated that coronavirus had impacted their livelihoods/income in the previous 12 months.

In the Round 2 survey data, among the households that cited that coronavirus had impacted their livelihoods/income in the past 12 months, the most cited ways were the inability to access markets to sell crops/products (40\%) and buy agricultural inputs (23\%). Other ways they cited were a basic reduction in overall income (19\%), inability to access healthcare (15\%), and illness (21\%).

### 4.3. COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS AND ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE

## "People are no longer going to the hospital like they used to- in order to prevent the community from thinking they have caught the coronavirus. If we have the flu, a fever, even the nurses are afraid to see us."

KII, June 2021
Although the population is generally aware of the cause and preventive measures of COVID-19, the pandemic has had a negative impact on accessing health care. The qualitative data indicate that people are aware of using masks and social distancing in public to reduce transmission. However, few people
actually use masks, even during the periods of heightened infections-generally because of lack of vigilance or lack of money to purchase masks.

In the Round 2 quantitative data, $41 \%$ of respondents indicated that they felt that someone in their household was at risk of contracting COVID-19. Among the households that did not report feeling this risk, most cited the reason as their belief in God, living in a rural area, or that it did not exist where they live. When asked about mitigation efforts to prevent the possible transmission of COVID-19, 61\% of respondents reported that they were washing their hands more than before the start of the COVID-19 crisis. $72 \%$ reported wearing a mask while out in public in the past week. Among those that did not wear a mask, most cited that they felt it was not necessary.

The Phase 1 qualitative data indicated that people were avoiding health care facilities because of COVID19 related concerns. In the Round 2 quantitative data, $20 \%$ of those interviewed indicated that they or someone in their household had delayed/skipped/been unable to complete health care visits in the previous year because of COVID-19. The specific reasons cited included fear of contracting COVID-19 (45\%), lack of money to pay for healthcare (29\%), lack of availability of healthcare (18\%), and fear of being quarantined (4\%).

Phase 2 qualitative data confirmed these findings. FGDs and KIls frequently indicate that people have been afraid to seek health care for fear of contracting COVID-19 and the stigma that suspected COVID19 infection causes. Additionally, in Phase 1 of the qualitative data collection, the fear of being quarantined if seeking care for any COVID-19-like symptoms was a very frequently cited concern, particularly by the KIs. For example, a KI in Mole Saint Nicholas stated that people are not going to the hospital like before to prevent the community from thinking they have caught COVID-19. Furthermore, the KI pointed out if they have the flu or a fever, even the nurses are afraid to see them.

### 4.4. IMPACTS OF DROUGHT, POOR WATER ACCESS AND INFRASTRUCTURE

## "If we just had better access to water, the rest of our problems would be a lot more manageable"

KII, January 2021
The impacts of drought (acute and chronic) on agriculture and livestock livelihoods, coupled with the severe lack of water and agriculture infrastructure such as irrigation, is one of the biggest underlying factors of household food insecurity, poverty, and low resilience in the areas studied. The KIs and FGD participants in both phases of data collection generally indicated that drought and chronic challenges related to water access were a larger shock than the COVID-19 related shocks.

Drought and drinking/irrigation water access were mentioned as one of the most significant shocks/challenges in every single qualitative KII and FGD. These interviews also indicated that people are planting less than they used to (beans, corn, peanuts, potatoes) because of the lack of rain. Disease and lack of forage due to drought have also caused significant livestock loss.

According to the Round 2 survey data, $76 \%$ of households must travel for more than 30 minutes to access drinking water, and $40 \%$ of households must travel for more than 2 hours to access drinking
water. Over $40 \%$ of households report getting their drinking water from an unsafe source (mainly surface water and unprotected springs). Water access was not measured in Round 1.

In the Round 2 survey, $65 \%$ of households reported practicing agriculture in the past year (even if not cited as one of the main livelihoods). Of those, only $6 \%$ reported having access to irrigation (mainly a canal or ditch). The remaining $94 \%$ reported relying only on rainfall.

### 4.5. AGRICULTURE AND OTHER LIVELIHOODS

"Because of the drought, people do not harvest potatoes, cassava, bananas to eat. Instead, they eat imported rice a lot more. There are changes in farming practices because people cannot sell the crops and they cannot store them .... so they are forced to switch to something that allows them to get the money as quickly as possible to survive, hence the proliferation of taxi-motos."

The use of agriculture as part of the main livelihood strategies is fluid. Although commonly practiced, the evidence indicates that it is not considered a viable or reliable primary source of income. The 69 households relying solely on agriculture have among the worst food security outcomes, with significantly lower median FCS, a greater mean depth of poverty, and a higher median score on the Household Hunger Scale compared to all other households reporting one or more sources of income. However, the 63 households that combined agriculture with one or more other income sources had better than average food security, comparable to other households with two or more non-agricultural income sources.

Looking at the changes in asset ownership between rounds, it is evident that households are selling off their productive agriculture assets to cope with the worsening economic and food security situation. The overall percentage of households owning agricultural equipment declined from $48 \%$ to $10 \%$, with similar significant trends in all three regions. Repeated drought combined with lack of agriculture infrastructure such as irrigation has further aggravated the challenges in relying on agriculture as a source of food/money. Participants in the qualitative data collection repeatedly indicated that young people are increasingly looking away from agriculture to other sources of income, such as moto-taxi driving. These income sources provide a more reliable source of income without the large investment of time, materials, and labor upfront that is required to grow crops.

The percentage of households reporting two or more sources of income increased from $24 \%$ in Round 1 to $34 \%$ in Round 2 ( $p=0.006$, McNemar's test), with $38 \%$ of households reporting more sources of livelihood and only $19 \%$ reporting fewer. Furthermore, the median number of livelihoods per household size increased from 0.17 to 0.2 ( $p=0.02$, Wilcoxon test).

Reductions in hunger were significantly associated with greater livelihood diversity in Round 2 , with the proportion of households with $41 \%$ of single-income households suffering from severe hunger compared with $23 \%$ of multi-income households. Furthermore, among the 69 households that reported a single income source in both rounds, severe hunger (HHS = 5 or 6 ) increased from $32 \%$ to $45 \%$.

Furniture and agricultural equipment were sold or discarded by households in every commune. The only notable increases in assets were cellphones (in Bombardopolis) and radios (in Bombardopolis and Mole St. Nicholas). While qualitative data also indicated that selling assets was a coping strategy that many had been using to get by, several FGD participants also indicated that many people no longer had anything of value to sell.

### 4.6. PSYCHOSOCIAL

"We are alone so we are more tired and sometimes discouraged."
FGD Participant, June 2021
To gain a better understanding of the psychosocial status of the interviewed households and how it relates to resilience to recent shocks, a specific set of questions was added to the Round 2 quantitative survey tool. The GHQ-12 (general health questionnaire) is an internationally used tool to measure psychological stress. ${ }^{20}$ The module consists of 12 questions addressing issues such as loss of sleep due to worries, loss of concentration, trouble making decisions, enjoyment of daily activities, feeling depressed, facing problems, etc., and asks the respondent to compare their current situation to a "normal" time. It is sensitive to short-term psychiatric disorders but not long-standing attributes of the respondent. In this study, it is used as a measure of "psychological stress" and not meant as a screening of particular psychiatric disorders.

Tulane introduced the GHQ-12 into a national food security survey conducted in 2011 (post-earthquake) as part of its evaluation research on the impact of post-earthquake assistance on resilience. ${ }^{21} \mathrm{At}$ that

[^12]time, the tool was translated into Creole and underwent field testing. This national survey serves as a reference point when calculating and interpreting the prevalence in this study.

Although no calibrated threshold for the GHQ-12 has been established for Haiti, uses of this indicator in other contexts reveal a large range of thresholds. In the analysis of the data from the 2011 survey, a variety of methods to discern a threshold were explored, and a very conservative threshold was applied, with the assumption that this would be more likely to UNDER-estimate the prevalence of psychological stress in the population. In 2011, the mean score nationally was 3.9 (using the binary scoring method, yielding a possible range of 0 to 12 ). Applying the conservative threshold of $6 / 7$ to this score resulted in a prevalence of $19 \%$ of those surveyed experiencing psychological stress.

Looking at the Round 2 survey data from the 2021 survey for this study, the GHQ-12 revealed high rates of psychological stress, with $28 \%$ of respondents scoring 7 or higher on the 12 -point binary scale. ${ }^{22}$ The prevalence varied significantly by commune, from 15\% of respondents in Anse Rouge to $23 \%$ in Mole Saint Nicholas to 45\% in Bombardopolis. Qualitative data revealed similar findings. KIs and FGD participants reported experiencing greater general fear and stress than usual because of the pandemic. For example, one focus group in Anse Rouge discussed how they relied on going to church during difficult times because it gave them some reassurance, but with the COVID-19 restrictions and concerns, people are going to church less, and so do not benefit from this reassurance. A KI from Bombardopolis described how COVID-19 is different from other shocks: "The coronavirus is more complicated. With misery we can find openings, strategies. With the Coronavirus, life is more complicated. We are scared. We cannot move."

There was clear evidence that psychological stress was associated with poverty and hunger. Among the 27 respondents with per capita daily spending above the estimated 2021 poverty line that completed the GHQ module, none showed evidence of severe stress, in contrast to $33 \%$ of the 161 respondents with expenditures below the poverty line. Greater depth of poverty was most closely associated with feelings of depression, low self-worth, low confidence, and an inability to concentrate. It should be noted that the overall correlation between the GHQ-12 and poverty or the HHS is low. While we observe that households living above the poverty line and those not experiencing hunger are unlikely to be experiencing psychological stress, only some households experiencing hunger and/or living below the poverty line are experiencing psychological stress. Interpretation of this relationship may require further research to understand the causal pathways, as psychological stress may be both an outcome of poverty and hunger and an underlying factor.

## 5. CONCLUSIONS

## Poverty and Food Security

- The increase in the prevalence of poverty between early 2020 and early 2021 was characterized by a decrease in household purchasing power following significant inflation of the Gourde.
- Absolute expenditures remained similar, but the amounts of goods and services acquired were reduced.
- The perception of experienced hunger (HHS) remained high and increased between rounds.
- Dietary diversity remained unchanged, and the prevalence of households with poor/borderline food consumption decreased.
- However, the small improvements in food consumption score do not appear to reflect improvements in quantity or diversity.
- Consumption/expenditure data from the poverty module indicate that households reporting more frequent consumption are likely consuming smaller quantities per day.
- Diets remained poor with infrequent consumption of fruits, vegetables, and animal protein.
- The population interviewed generally understood the cause of and preventative measures for COVID-19.
- The population does not generally perceive the COVID-19 pandemic as a specific shock in itself. There are relatively few reported cases in the areas studied.
- The difficulties associated with the COVID-19 pandemic (closing of schools, economic slowdown, lockdown, etc.) are seen as aggravating factors that worsen the impacts of other chronic and acute challenges and lessen the ability of the poor to employ their usual survival strategies.
- COVID-19 had a negative impact on access to healthcare due to lack of resources, lack of availability, fear of being quarantined, and possibly the stigma associated with suspected COVID19 infection.


## Livelihoods, Drought

- The impacts of drought (acute and chronic) on agriculture and livestock livelihoods, coupled with the severe lack of water and agriculture infrastructure such as irrigation, is one of the biggest underlying factors of household food insecurity, poverty, and low resilience in the areas studied.
- The use of agriculture as part of the main livelihood strategies is fluid. Although commonly practiced, the evidence indicates that it is not a viable or reliable primary/sole source of income.
- Investments in agriculture in these areas may not improve resilience or reduce poverty unless very large and long-term investments are made in water and irrigation infrastructure.


## Psychosocial

- Although psychological stress was only measured in Round 2, the prevalence was elevated compared to previous national estimates.
- Psychological stress is associated with poverty and hunger. None of those living above the poverty line reported elevated psychological stress. Greater depth of poverty was associated with depression, low self-worth, low confidence.
- Psychological stress may be both an outcome of poverty and hunger as well as an underlying factor. More research is needed to better understand the causal pathways.
