WHAT IS IDEAL?

IDEAL supports emergency and non-emergency food security activities to improve the overall effectiveness of their programming. Our work focuses on foundational skills that enable effective food security programming, including adaptive management, data collection and analysis, social and behavior change, social cohesion and social accountability, sustainability, and sequencing, layering, and integration. In the closing years of IDEAL, we have a particular focus on humanitarian-development-peace coherence.


