FFP Strategy Update: New opportunities for input from our food security partners

Since its last public consultation at the TOPS/FSN Network Meeting in July, the Office of Food for Peace (FFP) has been engaged in ongoing discussion, key informant interviews and strategy development sessions with FFP staff, other USAID food security experts and a number of academics and researchers.
