Draft of the FFP Strategy 2016-2025 Released for Public Review and Comment

The USAID Office of Food for Peace (FFP) draft strategy 2016-2025 is available for public review and comment.

Dear Food for Peace colleagues and partners,

I am very pleased to share a draft of the Food for Peace Strategy 2016-2025 for your review and comment. The plan is the result of a long and highly participatory process that reached many hundreds of individuals on several continents.

The vision outlined in this strategy and the accompanying strategic results framework are designed to capture our evolution, the best of what we currently do, as well as the ways we need to adapt to achieve greater impact with greater efficiency and sustainability in the future.

I am writing to ask for written comments on this draft by Wednesday July 27th. Please keep the following considerations in mind:

- The **strategic results framework** was developed and validated in a highly consultative process over the course of more than a year. FFP presented and provided opportunity for comment on the most recent version at the FSN Network meeting on January 28th, 2016. We do not envision re-opening discussion on the framework itself.
- The **M&E frame** for the Strategy will be presented in a public consultation in August, 2016. You will have the opportunity to express any recommendations or concerns over indicators at that time. For the time being, we ask that you please focus on the draft strategy text.

- Finally, to manage this process most effectively, and to ensure that each partner organization is submitting consistent feedback, we will be accepting only **one set of comments per organization**. The Strategy and this communication are being sent out through lists for the Food Aid Consultative Group, FSN Network, and Interaction Food Security and Agriculture Working Group. So, please coordinate internally to ensure one consolidated and consistent set of comments.

Please provide your written comments on the draft by COB Wednesday, July 27th.

Comments should be submitted in a separate Word document, specifying page number, a clear explanation of the issue being raised and, where relevant, suggested revised language. Please send all comments – and any questions you may have regarding this process - to ffpconsultations@usaid.gov.

Thanks in advance for the time you will give to reviewing and commenting on the draft Strategy. It is an exciting moment in FFP history as we put the finishing touches on a paper that outlines our vision for the future. Your inputs have been and will be extremely important and I hope you find the draft in keeping with your expectations.
