### **EFSP DC Stakeholder Workshop**

Tuesday, November 7, 2017 | 8:30 AM - 12:30 PM EST Save the Children, 899 North Capitol St. NE, Suite 900, Washington, DC 20002 and Online

The USAID Office of Food for Peace (FFP) and TANGO International are pleased to host a stakeholder workshop and webinar for Market Based Emergency Food Assistance Program implementing partners.

TANGO will present the main findings from their review of FFP's Market-Based Emergency Food Assistance Programs, with examples from seven country case studies. The objectives of the review are to (1) document the history and evolution of FFP's market-based emergency food assistance programs; (2) review program design and implementation processes; (3) analyze program cost-efficiency trends; and (4) qualitatively assess the effects of FFP projects on local economies and market actors. The presentation will be followed by a plenary discussion and small group work to respond to findings and recommendations.

The workshop will be geared toward organization staff who oversee market-based emergency food security activities, including directors, heads of M&E for emergency programs, and VP level staff.

The event will be In-Person and Online. For our remote participants, the livestream will only include the presentation and the plenary discussion. Lunch to follow the event.

### Frontiers in Resilience Measurement and Evaluation

Thursday, November 9, 2017 | 4:30 PM - 5:15 PM EST Washington Marriott Wardman Park, 2660 Woodley Road NW, Washington, DC 20008

Incredible progress has been made in measuring household resilience to the impacts of natural disasters and other crises. This has been achieved through efforts to monitor recovery post shock (e.g. post-earthquake Nepal, post-typhoon Philippines, complex emergencies in Somalia, etc.) as well as prospective holistic assessments to understand the dynamic social, ecological and economic systems within which communities operate and how they are affected by shocks.

Knowing what makes households resilient is only half the battle - now practitioners must evaluate what works to build resilience. Validating a resilience approach to international development must be built on empirical evidence demonstrating efficacy and cost-effectiveness - otherwise resilience proponents remain vulnerable to skepticism, critique, and rejection. This panel at the <u>American Evaluation Association Conference</u>, comprised of four resilience measurement experts from Mercy Corps, Oxfam UK, TANGO International, and Tulane University will share their experience and insights of recently concluded studies responding to these questions. Presenters will discuss methodological approaches, challenges, key findings, and issues for future research.

### The USAID Food Aid Product Mix: Presentation of Stakeholder Feedback

Food aid programs are often used in places where undernutrition is a major public health challenge. The USAID-funded Food Aid Quality Review Phase III (FAQR), implemented through Tufts University, has been conducting interviews with development, nutrition, and health practitioners working on USAID-funded programs that use food aid. In these interviews, FAQR asked: Does the mix of available food aid products meet programming needs? Is guidance on their use helpful and sufficient? How can donors better communicate about food aid with implementing partners? FAQR will present the responses to these questions, elicit feedback from participants on their experience with these issues, and explore possible solutions with participants. CORE Group's Nutrition Working Group invites program designers, nutrition advisors, commodity managers, and others involved in programming food aid to join this conversation.


These documents serve as an update to <u>the previous FFPIB document</u> outlining eligible uses of Section 202(e) and ITSH funds published on August 15th, 2017.

### Narrated Presentation on the Permagarden Method

The Permagarden method draws from permaculture and bio-intensive agriculture to create a climate-smart approach to home gardening. The method combines sustainable agriculture practices from several approaches and movements, and teaches how to design and integrate multiple agriculture practices in order to increase production and create a more resilient garden. While it can be implemented anywhere, it was specifically developed for low-resource, dryland areas.

# Abstract Submission Open for 2018 International Social and Behavior Change Communication Summit | Deadline: November 27, 2017

The 2018 International Social and Behavior Change Communication (SBCC) Summit featuring Entertainment Education is organized to understand better what works in shifting social norms, changing behaviors and in amplifying the voice of those who have most at stake in the success of development efforts. And, it is designed to wrestle with the profound issues of social justice and agenda setting that affect these decisions. Who decides, for example, what behaviors need changing or which norms should be shifted? How can people's realities and voices be put at the center of such change? How much emphasis should be placed on shifting norms and behaviors when power structures, policy environments or lack of services may constitute problems that overwhelm the capacity of individuals or communities to act? The 2018 Summit will address some of the primary challenges facing the SBCC community: understanding what approaches work and what investments in SBCC programming can expect to deliver, and making sense of the complexity and diversity in the field of SBCC that would facilitate greater investment. The Summit will be organized around three overarching themes: 1) What Works, 2) Making Sense of the Field Now, and 3) Voice and Agenda Setting. #### Food Systems for Healthy and Sustainable Diets Course | Deadline: April 23, 2018

Food systems considers all the actors, elements and activities that relate to primary producing, processing, distributing, preparing and consuming food and waste disposal; and the socio-economic and environmental outcomes of these activities. The course explores food systems from a dietary perspective and discuss which components are related to the diet gaps for different populations groups at national, regional and global level. It discusses possible actions to be taken to transform the food system for addressing the gaps and how these actions can be leveraged in a sustainable way. The training targets staff of governmental and non-governmental organisations. The course is job-oriented and the training approach is interactive, experience as well as evidence-based: it provides the participants with the possibility to learn from expert facilitators as well as from each other.
